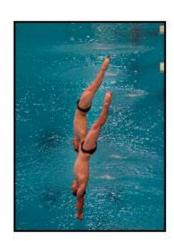

GENERATION NEXT READY TO LEAP INTO GAMES CONTENTION

A new generation of Australian Divers will take their first major leaps towards Beijing when the 2007 Australian Open Championships are contested at the Melbourne Sports and Aquatic Centre from January 12 - 14.

The three-day event will double as the selection trials for the FINA World Swimming Championships in Melbourne in March and will be headlined by Commonwealth Games stars, **Melissa Wu**, **Alex Croak**, **Sharleen Stratton**, **Bree Cole and Kathryn Blackshaw**

At just 14 years of age and weighing just 30 kilograms, Wu has become one of the real stars of an Australian diving troupe that has undergone massive changes since the 2004 Athens Olympics.

Wu captured the imagination of the Australian sporting nation with her Amazing skills off the ten-metre platform throughout a meteoric rise in 2006.

Along with her 10-metre platform partner, former Olympic gymnast Croak, the pair were among many stars of Australia's most successful Commonwealth Games in Melbourne last year.

Wu's smile, courage, demeanor and maturity way beyond her 14 years certainly captured the hearts of a nation.

Combine them with the catwalk good looks of former Olympic and Commonwealth Games gold medal-winning gymnast, Croak and the duo will be the centre of attention on the 10 metre platform.

Wu and Croak will attempt to carry on the traditions of retired Olympic gold medalist Chantelle Newbery and recently married Olympic bronze medalist and Commonwealth Games golden girl Loudy Tourky.

Stratton and Cole, who combined to win gold for Australia on the three-metre synchonised boards, will be the ones to watch both on one and three-metre.

The rising youngsters will be looking to fill the gaps left by the retirement of not only Olympic gold medallist in Chantelle Newbery but also the departure of her Olympic and Commonwealth Games medallist husband Robert Newbery, Olympic individual silver medalist Mathew Helm and three-metre synchro bronze medallist Steven Barnett.

Recently married Tourky, who has taken a 12-month hiatus from the sport, will also be missing from these championships.

In the men's competition, all eyes will be on Commonwealth Games representative 19-year-old Scott Robertson who was a finalist in the Melbourne Games in the individual three metre and synchronised events.

A strong and improved performer at last year's FINA World Cup in China, Robertson will be looking to step up at these championships and form the future of the sport in the men's ranks alongside World Junior representatives, Peter Hill and Grant Nel heading forward onto Beijing in 2008.

Australia's National Head Coach Hui Tong said the next 12 months represented a major building phase not only for Beijing but for the 2012 Olympics in London.

"It is not easy to replace divers of the calibre of Chantelle and Robert Newbery, Mat Helm and Steve Barnett but we will be looking to unearth some new talent at these Championships," said Hui.

"The girls look stronger than the boys at the moment and there are certainly great opportunities for some young divers to step up.

"The Olympics are only 18 months away and it is important for our team to perform well at home and to show the rest of the world that we will be ready for the challenge in 2008 and 2012."

COMPETITIVE FORMAT

The **one-metre springboard** events (NON OLYMPIC) consist of unlimited (degree of difficulty) dives only in each round of competition- five dives for women and six dives for men. After the preliminary is complete the top six divers with odd numbered ranking (1st, 3rd,) compete in semi-final A, and the top six even ranked divers (2nd, 4th,) compete in semi-final B. The top three from each semi-final advance to the final and compete in reverse order of their semi-final scores.

In the individual **three-metre springboard** and all **platform** events, dives consist of unlimited dives in the preliminary, limited (low degree of difficulty) dives in the semi-finals, and repeat their unlimited dives in the final. The top 18 from the preliminary move on to the semi-final. Based on combined preliminary/semi-final scores, the top 12 advance to the final. Divers' semi-final scores are then carried through to the final, with final ranking determined by combined semi-final/final scores.

Types of Dives

There are six different groups of platform and springboard dives. The first four types involve rotating in different directions relative to the board and the starting position. The fifth group includes any dive with a twist, and the final group, used in platform diving, begins with an arm stand.

- 1. *Forward Group*: The diver faces the front of the board and rotates toward the water. Dives in this group range from the simple front dive to the difficult four and one-half somersault. Dive numbers in this group begin with the number one (eg. 107B).
- 2. **Backward Group**: All the dives in this group begin with the diver on the end of the board with their back to the water. The direction of rotation is away from the board. Dive numbers in this group begin with the number two (eq. 205B).
- 3. **Reverse Group**: These dives begin with the diver facing the front of the board (using a forward approach) and rotating towards the board. Dive numbers in this group begin the number three (eg. 305C).
- 4. *Inward Group*: The diver stands on the end of the board with their back to the water and rotates toward the board, the opposite of the backward groups' movement. Dives numbers in this group begin with the number four (eg. 405B).
- 5. *Twisting Group*: Any dive with a twist is included in this group. There are four types of twisting dives, forward, backward, reverse and inward. Due to the possible combinations this group includes more dives than any other. Dive numbers in this group begin with the number five (eg 5253B).
- 6. **Arm stand Group**: In platform diving there is a sixth, unique group of dives called 'arm stands'. here the diver assumes a handstand position on the edge of the platform before executing the dive. Dive numbers in this group begin with the number six (eg. 6241B).

Judging

Divers are judged by a panel of seven judges who give a score between zero (0) and ten (10) points for each dive performed. The points awarded can categorise dives as follows:

0	completely failed
0.5-2	unsatisfactory
2.5-4.5	deficient
5.0-6.0	satisfactory
6.5-8.0	good
8.5-10	very good

In classifying a dive into one of the judging categories, certain parts of each dive must be analysed and evaluated, and an overall award obtained.

The parts of the dive are:

- 1. Approach- Should be smooth but forceful showing good form.
- 2. Take-off- Must show control and balance, plus the proper angle of leaving and landing for the particular dive being attempted.

- 3. *Elevation* The amount of spring or lift a diver receives from the take-off greatly affects the appearance of the dive. Since more height means more time, a higher dive generally affords greater accuracy and smoothness of motion.
- 4. *Execution* This is most important, for this is the actual dive. A judge watches for proper mechanical performance, technique, form and grace.
- 5. Entry-The entry into the water is very significant because it is the last thing a judge sees and the part probably remembered best. The two criteria evaluated at entry are the angle of entry- which should be vertical, and the amount of splash- which should be as little as possible.

Scoring

Individual events- when all seven judges have allocated a score for a dive, the high and low scores are eliminated and the remaining scores totalled. This number is then multiplied by the degree of difficulty (DD) rating assigned to the dive. DD for a given dive is assigned by FINA and calculated to one decimal place (eg. 3.1). The resulting value is then averaged and multiplied by 3 to represent a score that would have been achieved if judged by three judges.

Synchronised events- in synchronised events, two judges rate one diver, two judges rate the other diver, and five judges rate the pair. The high and low individual scores are eliminated, leaving seven scores to be processed as above.

Olympics. He then moved into coaching and was the National Team and Assistant Coach of the National Training Centre (Junior Development) in Beijing, China, from 1987-90. He moved to Canada and was Assistant Coach and then Head Coach with Dive Calgary Sports Society for a decade. In 2001, he joined the AIS Diving program in Australia. Hui is assisted by Coach Wang Tong Xiang who, for 13 years, was a coach at the Beijing Institute of Diving in China and then Assistant Head Coach at the Chinese Sports Centre in China. He joined the AIS Diving program as Senior Coach in 1990. Hui Tong, as Australia's head diving coach in Athens, oversaw Australia's best ever-Olympic diving success at the recent Athens Olympics. He is considered to be one of the world's top diving coaches and he has been reappointed to spearhead the Australian team towards the 2008 Games in Beijing. Prior to the arrival of Hui Tong Australia had not won a gold medal at an Olympics in 80 years.
